In late 2010, **AIDS Education and Prevention** will publish a Special Supplement focused on the monitoring and evaluation of HIV CTR and HIV testing services. The goal of the Special Supplement is to bring together a variety of findings and perspectives which explore how data about HIV CTR and HIV testing services are collected, managed, quality assured, analyzed, and utilized and strategies for improving the quality of these processes.

We are seeking papers that address the topics below. Approaches may include formative, process, outcome, impact, and cost effectiveness evaluations.

- Monitoring and evaluation of HIV CTR or HIV testing services at the global, national, state and local levels
- Monitoring and evaluation of HIV CTR or HIV testing services in special settings including but not limited to emergency departments, urgent care clinics, substance abuse treatment centers, and correctional facilities
- Innovative methods, tools, or technology for improving collection of HIV CTR or HIV testing data (e.g., using PDAs to collect data)
- HIV CTR or HIV testing data quality assurance processes
- Strategies for using HIV CTR or HIV testing data to assess and improve HIV prevention programs and community planning efforts
- Triangulation of HIV CTR or HIV testing data with other data sources (e.g., HIV surveillance data) for evaluation and planning of HIV prevention programs
- Using geographic information systems (GIS) to evaluate HIV CTR or HIV testing programs and facilitate program planning
- Building the capacity of agencies to monitor and evaluate HIV CTR or HIV testing services
- Other topics related to the monitoring and evaluation of HIV CTR or HIV testing services not identified by this call are invited

#### Timeline and Requirements

- The deadline for submission of completed manuscripts is **April 30, 2010**. Manuscripts should not exceed 20 pages including references. An additional 4 pages for four tables/figures are allowed.
