Instructions to Authors

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Suicide and Life-Threatening Behavior is devoted to emergent theoretical, clinical, and public health approaches related to violent, self-destructive, and life-threatening behaviors. It is multidisciplinary and concerned with a broad range of related topics including, but not limited to, suicide, suicide prevention, death, accidents, biology of suicide, epidemiology, crisis intervention, postvention with survivors, nomenclature, standards of care, clinical training and interventions, violence, euthanasia, and assisted suicide.

General Guidelines for Authors

Brief Summary. Manuscripts should be submitted in quadruplicate with a 100-word abstract. The entire manuscript, including references, quotations, text, and tables, should be double-spaced, typed on one side on 8½ x 11 regular bond paper. American Psychological Association standard style should be used. Manuscript length, except under unusual circumstances, should not be over 20 double-spaced pages, and, ordinarily, should be shorter.

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Abstracts. The abstract should be displayed on a separate page and consist of not more than 100 words. It should present the reason for the study, the main findings, and the principal conclusions.
